Plant: Full Sun

Spacing: 2' - 4'

Grow: 6' - 8'

Soil Type: pH 4.0 - 6.0

Zone: 4 - 7

How to Plant:

Plant roots in a hole 6" - 8" deep.

All blueberries are self pollinating, but will yield a larger crop if more than one variety is planted.

Grape

(Seedless)

Plant: Full Sun

Spacing: 2' - 4'

Grow: 3' - 6'

Soil Type: pH 5.5 - 7.5

Zone: 4 - 8

Color: Blue

How to Plant:

Dig a trench 6" wide and 10" - 12" deep. Spread roots in bottom of trench and cover with soil. Main stem should be 1/2 to 1/3 below ground level.

How to Plant:

The top of the root on the cane should only be 1" below ground level. Spread roots out to allow plant to sucker up from the bottom.

Blueberries

This sweet fruit is the #1 antioxidant.

Antioxidants are thought to help protect the body against the damaging effects of free radicals and the chronic diseases associated with the aging process. Fresh fruits, including blueberries, contain many of these naturally occurring antioxidants such as Vitamins C and E.

How to care for your plants upon arrival: Remove Blueberry plants from shipping box immediately. Store Blueberry plants in a cool moist place and untie the bundles. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Blueberries require an acid soil, a pH of 4.5 to 6. For best results, blueberries should be planted in peat (can also use a mixture of 2/3 peat to 1/3 soil). Blueberries also like a moist soil, but should not stand in water. The plant should be watered often in summer, when it sets fruit for the coming year.

Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. Plant roots in a shallow hole 6" deep, 12"– 24" in diameter. Mix soil - 2/3 Canadian Peat Moss and 1/3 soil from same hole. Fill hole 3" from top with mixture. Set plant in hole and cover with rest of the mixture. Water, then mound plant up at base 4"– 6" high with remaining mixture. Plant 2' – 4' apart. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

Where to plant: Full sun.

Blueberries

Most blueberries are self pollinating, but will yield a larger crop if more than one variety is planted.

Earliblue – One of the first blueberries of the season. Ripens in June producing a large sweet berry. Self-pollinating, but will yield larger crops if pollinated with Bluecrop or Blueray.
Fruit Size: Large **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm
(Zone 4–7)

Duke – An early season with a large, firm berry with good color. Plant is vigorous and grows upright.
Fruit Size: Large **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 4–7)

Blueetta – A late blooming, early ripening variety perfect for colder climates. Medium sized berry, with moderate to high fruit production.
Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 4–7)

Patriot – Ripens early. The fruit is large and has very good flavor. The bush is vigorous.
Fruit Size: Large **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 3–7)

Northland – Ripens early in the season. Fruit is medium size, medium firm with a wild berry flavor. The bush is vigorous and productive. Recommended for northern areas.
Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 3–7)

Blueray – Ripens in July. It is very large with a sweet flavor.
Fruit Size: Large **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 4–7)

Bluecrop – Ripens early to mid-season. This blueberry is light in color. It is the best all around variety. It has high quality fruit and is disease resistant. Great for U-Pick.
Fruit Size: Large **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Very Firm (Zone 4–7)

Draper – Early to mid-season. Compact bush produces large, firm, light blue berries that hold well. Great for farm stands. An attractive plant for edible landscaping.
Fruit Size: Large **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 4–7)

Berkeley – Ripens in Mid-July and produces the largest and the sweetest of all blueberries.
Fruit Size: Very Large **Flavor:** Very Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 5–7)





Blueberries

Rancocas – A mid-season berry. Great for freezing and baking. A great berry for desserts.

Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Sweet
Firmness: Firm (Zone 4–7)

Rubel – A mid-season berry. The smaller berry tends to give a much a better presentation when used for baking.

Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Sweet
Firmness: Very Firm (Zone 4–8)

Coville – A mid-season berry. Produces a large crop. Needs cross pollinator – plant near another blueberry variety.

Fruit Size: Large **Flavor:** Sweet/Tart **Firmness:** Firm
(Zone 3–8)

Jersey – A mid to late season berry. The bush is very vigorous and productive.

Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 4–7)

Legacy – Late mid-season berry. Grows in a wide range of soil types. Heavy producer. Plants should be trimmed annually due to weight of fruit.

Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Very Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 5–8)

Pink Lemonade – A late-season berry with a sweet, lemony flavor. Will do better with another variety that blooms around the same time. More compact bush. Berries are dark pink when ripe. An attractive addition to desserts.

Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Very Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 4–8)

Elliott – A late season berry. The fruit is medium in size, firm, light blue and has good flavor. The bush is vigorous, upright, winter hardy and productive. It is suitable for both hand picking and mechanical harvesting.

Fruit Size: Medium **Flavor:** Sweet **Firmness:** Firm (Zone 4–7)

Blackberries

Eat them fresh, frozen or canned! They make delicious pies, syrup, jams and jellies!

How to care for your plants upon arrival: Remove Blackberry plants from shipping box immediately. Store Blackberry plants in a cool moist place and untie the bundles. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Requires neutral soil, a pH of 6.5 to 7. Plants will grow in any type of well-drained soil. **Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.**

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. The top root on the cane should only be 1" below the ground level. If planted too deep, it will not grow a new shoot from the base of the plant. Plants should be spaced 3'– 4' apart. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

Where to plant: Full sun

Thornless Blackberries

Natchez – Semi-erect. Very large, very firm fruit with excellent flavor. (Zone 6–9)

Prime Ark Freedom – Erect. Early season, rust resistant variety that sets a crop on floricanes in June and another primocane crop around August. Large, sweet fruit. (Zone 5–9)

Arapaho – Erect. Very firm, large fruit with small seeds. Excellent flavor. (Zone 5–9)

Ouachita – Erect. Attractive very large glossy fruit with excellent flavor. High yields. Great for farm stands. (Zone 6–9)

Apache – Erect. Super-sized fruit with excellent flavor to boot! Large yields. (Zone 6–9)

Navaho – Semi-erect. Medium sized black fruit with the best flavor and highest sugar content. (Zone 6–10)

Hull – Trailing. Medium to large fruit with a mild flavor. Good producer. Good winter survival. (Zone 5–9)

Triple Crown – Vigorous and productive with large, sweet fruit. Can tolerate some cold. (Zone 5–8)

Chester – Semi-erect. Mild, flavorful medium-sized fruit with high yields. Can tolerate drier conditions once established. (Zone 5–8)

Thorny Blackberries

Darrow – Erect. Large, sweet fruit. Vigorous growing and very thorny. Tolerates cold better than thornless varieties. (Zone 3–8)

Raspberries

Eat canned, fresh or frozen! Raspberries make delicious pies, syrup, jams & jellies!

How to care for your plants upon arrival: Remove Raspberry plants from shipping box immediately. Store Raspberry plants in a cool moist place and untie the bundles. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Requires neutral soil, a pH of 6.5 to 7. Will grow in any type of well-drained soil. **Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.**

How to plant: **Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark.** The top root on the cane should be 1" below the ground level. Plants should be spaced 18" apart. Press soil firmly around the roots and water well. Water regularly. Do not over water. Do not hoe/cultivate around raspberry plants, as new growth (suckers) comes from the plant's roots. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

Where to plant: Full sun.

Red Raspberries



Prelude (Summer bearing) – Earliest summer bearing red raspberry. Hardy and vigorous. Firm berries that are great for farm stands or u-pick. Primocanes may bear a small crop in the fall. Ripens in late June/early July and again late August. **(Zone 4–8)**

Boyne (Summer bearing) – Very winter hardy. Heavy producer of medium-sized deep red berries that ripen a week or more before Latham. Great for fresh eating, freezing and jam/jelly. Ripens in late June/early July and again late August. **(Zone 3–7)**

Killarney (Summer bearing) – Mid-season winter hardy variety. Bright red medium-sized berries with a good raspberry flavor. Ripens in late June/early

Latham (Summer bearing) – A reliable favorite. Deep red in color and sweet. Firm berries excellent for farm stands, freezing and jams and jellies. Ripens in late June/early July and again late August. **(Zone 3–8)**

Nova (Summer bearing) – Very winter hardy but adapts well to other climates. Produces high yields of firm, sweet/tart bright red berries. Nova will set a fall crop in Southern regions. Ripens in late June/early July and again late August. **(Zone 3–8)**

Cascade Delight (Summer bearing) – This variety is more tolerant to wetter garden conditions. Resists root-rot. Heavy yields of firm berries with a rich raspberry flavor. **(Zone 6–9)**

Amity (Everbearing) – Large, very sweet flavored firm red berries. Winter hardy variety. Ripens in late June/early July and again late August. **(Zone 3–9)**

Caroline (Everbearing) – A very productive plant that produces large, sweet fruit. Disease resistant. **(Zone 4–7)**

Heritage (Everbearing) – Ripens in late June/early July and again late August. Produces high yielding fruit with a good sweet flavor. **(Zone 4–8)**

Yellow Raspberries

Fall Gold (Everbearing) – Extremely sweet golden berries, softer fruit. Excellent for eating fresh or for freezing. The canes are vigorous and adapt well to many soil types. **Pick and eat berry.** **(Zone 4–8)**

Anne (Everbearing) – High yields of large, firm, pale yellow fruit. Very sweet flavor. Fruits in July or August until it frosts. **(Zone 4–8)**

NEW **Double Gold** (Everbearing) – Sets lovely crops of golden peach/coral cone-shaped berries. Excellent flavor! Great for farm stands. **(Zone 4–8)**

Currants



Currants are a great source of Vitamin C. The plant is a fast-growing deciduous shrub reaching about 4-6 feet tall. Currants are a natural deer deterrent. Great for jams and jellies.

How to care for your plants upon arrival: Remove Currant plants from shipping box immediately and untie the bundles. Store Currant plants in a cool moist place. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Requires a soil pH of 5 to 8. Plants will grow in any well-drained soil.

Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. The top root on the cane should be 1" below the ground level. Plants should be spaced 2' apart. Press soil firmly around the roots and water well. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

Where to plant: Full Sun

Perfection (Red) – Large easy to pick clusters of bright- red fruit. Good quality. Plants are vigorous and hardy. (Zone 3–7)

Red Lake (Red) – Produces clusters of large sweet, red berries, in July. Vigorous, cold hardy, self pollinating. Makes delicious jelly. (Zone 3–7)

Imperial (White) – Translucent fruit with a pink blush. This berry is considered to have the richest flavor of all currants. (Zone 3–5)

Primus (White) – Heavy producer of large clusterless sweet berries. High in vitamin C. Good disease resistance. (Zone 3–8)

Consort (Black) – Winter hardy. Deer deterrent. Excellent source of Vitamin C. Makes great preserves and wine flavoring. The plant has a unique musky scent and is resistant to white pine blister rust. (Zone 3–7)

Gooseberries

Gooseberries are a great source of Vitamin C. The plant is a fast growing, small thorny deciduous shrub growing about 4-6 feet. The plant fruits in July and has various colors and flavors.

How to care for your plants upon arrival: Remove Gooseberry plants from shipping box immediately and untie the bundles. Store Gooseberry plants in a cool moist place. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Requires a soil pH of 5 to 8. Plants will grow in any well-drained soil.
Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. The top root on the cane should be 1" below the ground level. Plants should be spaced 2' apart. Press soil firmly around the roots and water well. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

Where to plant: Full sun.

Pixwell – Bush is extremely winter hardy and very productive. Fruit is large in size, pink-red-deep purple in color, has thin skin. **(Zone 3–7)**

Captivator – Large tear shaped fruit. The berries have a sweet flavor, colored pink to red when ripe in late July. **(Zone 4–8)**

Hinnomaki – Large, Red, sweet berry on a compact thorny deciduous shrub. **(Zone 4–7)**

Jostaberries

Jostaberry is a cross between a Gooseberry and a Black Currant. Thorn-free, vigorous and disease resistant. Fruit is high in vitamin C and forms in large clusters. Fruit is ideal for eating fresh, juice, jams and jellies. Ripens in July. Self-pollinating.

How to care for your plants upon arrival: Remove Jostaberry plants from shipping box immediately. Store Jostaberry plants in a cool moist place and untie the bundles. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Requires a soil pH of 6 to 7.5. Plants will grow in any well-drained soil. **Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.**

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. Plant deep enough to accommodate the roots without crowding them. Plants should be spaced 3'– 6' apart. Press soil firmly around the roots and water well. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

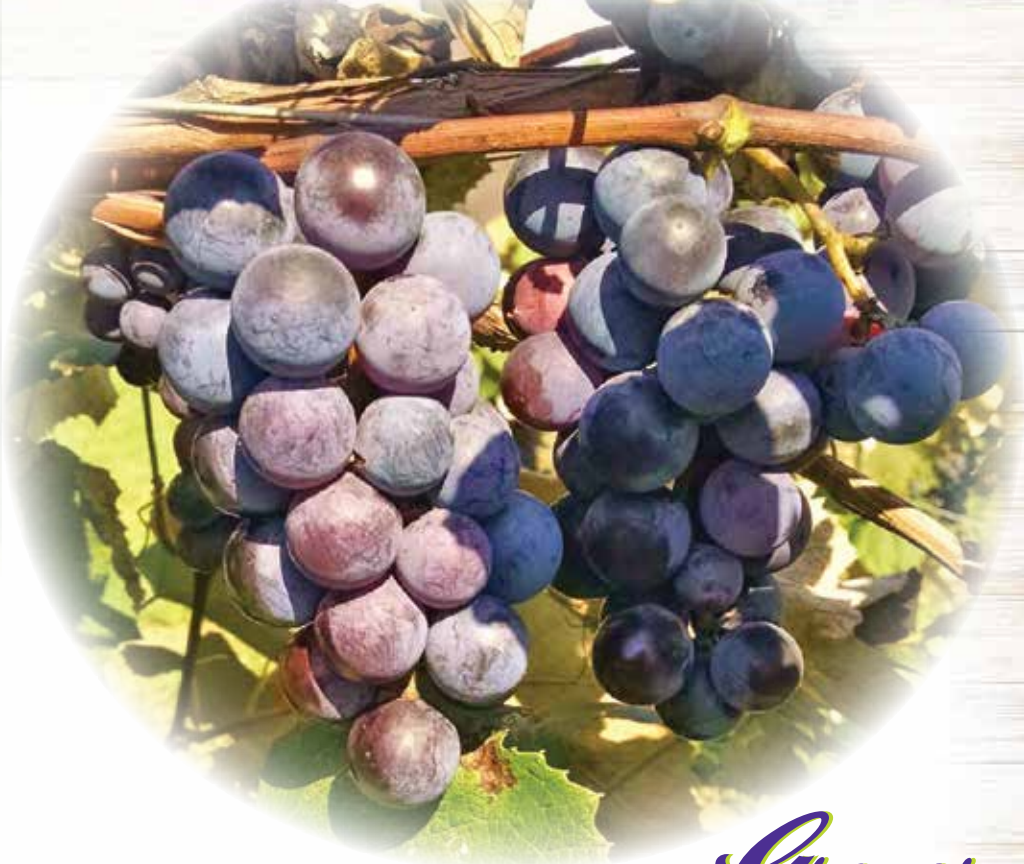

Grapes

Grapes produce their fruit in the fall, mid-September until it freezes.

How to care for your plants upon arrival: Remove Grape plants from shipping box immediately. Store Grape plants in a cool moist place and untie the bundles. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Will grow in a range from 5.5 to 7.0 pH. Plant in any type of well-drained soil. **Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.**

How to plant: **Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark.** Dig a trench 6" wide and 10"–12" deep. Place roots in bottom of trench and cover with soil. Main stem of plant should be 1/2 – 1/3 below ground level. Plants should be spaced 5' apart. Water regularly. Do not over water. Vines should be put on a trellis or wires second year. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

Seeded Grapes

How to care for upon arrival: Remove Fig plants from shipping box immediately. Untie the bundles. Store Fig plants in a cool moist place. Keep Fig plants moist at all times. Do not over water.

What type of soil: Requires a neutral pH 6 to 6.5. Will grow in a wide variety of well-drained soil. **Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.**

How to plant: **Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark.** Dig a hole large enough to accommodate roots without crowding. Top of collar (where stem meets roots) should be even with the surface of the soil. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** If potting, choose a container large enough to allow for root growth. Upgrade container size as plant grows. Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

Elderberries

How to care for plants upon arrival: Remove plants from shipping box immediately. Untie the bundles. Store Elderberry plants in a cool moist place. Keep roots moist at all times. Do not over water. (Zone 3–8)

What type of soil: Requires a moderately acid soil pH 5.5 to 6. Can be planted in a moist area, as long as it is well-drained.

Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. Elderberry plants can grow 10' to 15' tall and about 4' wide. Place plants in a shallow hole about 5' apart with 6' to 8' between rows. Elderberries require a cross pollinator- another variety should be planted close by. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

How to care for your root upon arrival: Remove Rhubarb from shipping box immediately. Store Rhubarb in a cool dry place. Rhubarb maybe stored in dry sawdust. Rhubarb roots have a short shelf life.

What type of soil: Prefers slightly acid soil pH 6 to 6.8. Well–drained soil.

Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.

How to plant: **Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark.** Dig a hole 2”– 3” deeper than the division/root. Place in the hole facing up 2”– 3” below ground level. Plant 2’ apart. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** We recommend potting rhubarb divisions in a two gallon container. Roots may be potted in a one gallon container.

When to plant: Rhubarb is a cool weather growing plant – plant as early as possible in the springtime.

Asparagus

Spears are delicious fresh or can be frozen or canned.

How to care for your roots upon arrival: Remove Asparagus roots from shipping box immediately and untie the bundles. Do not water Asparagus roots. If you are going to keep roots longer than two weeks, untie bunch and spread roots out. Store in a cool dry place.

What type of soil: Prefers a soil pH 6.8 to 7.2. Will grow in any type of well-drained soil.
Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. Dig a trench 8" deep. Roots should be laid flat in bottom of trench with crown (top of root) upright in middle with roots spread evenly in each direction. Space plants in trench approximately 9"-12" apart so roots of each crown touch. Only put 2" to 3" of soil on top of roots at time of planting. As plant grows, more soil should be added. Water regularly. Do not over water. **Do not mulch around our plants.** It is better not to take spears the first growing season. This should provide you with a better crop the next season. Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

Where to plant: In full sun, leaving the asparagus fern to die back in fall.

How to care for your crowns upon arrival: Remove Strawberry plants from shipping box immediately. Untie the Strawberry plants and remove the string. Keep Strawberry plants refrigerated until planting.

What type of soil: Requires a soil pH of 6.5 to 6.8. Well-drained soil.

Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.

How to plant: Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark. Plant in a 6" – 8" deep furrow so that the crown is just above the soil. All roots need to be below ground for better growing success. Plants should be 12"–18" apart within the row and 3' – 4' apart between the rows. Water regularly. Do not over water. Overcrowding will result in a smaller berry. Fertilize when runners begin. **Straw mulch may be used around plants after established.** Potting in containers smaller than one gallon size is not recommended. Do not trim roots.

When to plant: In the spring after chance of frost has passed.

Where to plant: Full Sun

Garlic

Garlic has been used for thousands of years as a seasoning, culinary ingredient and for medicinal purposes.

How to care for your bulbs upon arrival: Remove from shipping box. Store in a dry location until ready to plant.

What type of soil: Prefers a soil with a high organic content but will grow in a wide range of soils and Ph levels. **Plant only in soil. Do not plant in any non-soil media.**

How to plant: **Do not plant/pot in any type of media containing wood chips or bark.** Place cloves in a row 4" – 8" apart and 2" deep, with the pointed end facing up. Rows should be 6" – 12" apart. Water regularly. Do not over water. When planted in areas where the ground freezes, garlic beds should be mulched heavily with straw or leaves to ensure proper overwintering. Potting in containers smaller than one gallon is not recommended.

When to plant: Hard neck- Late fall after frost but before the ground freezes.
Soft neck- As soon as the ground is workable in late winter, or in early spring.

Where to plant: Full sun

Inchelium Red (Soft neck) – Grows in warmer climates. May grow in some Northern climates with limited success. Approx. 13 cloves per bulb. Medium flavor that's great for cooking. Sweeter flavor when roasted. **(Zone 6–10)**

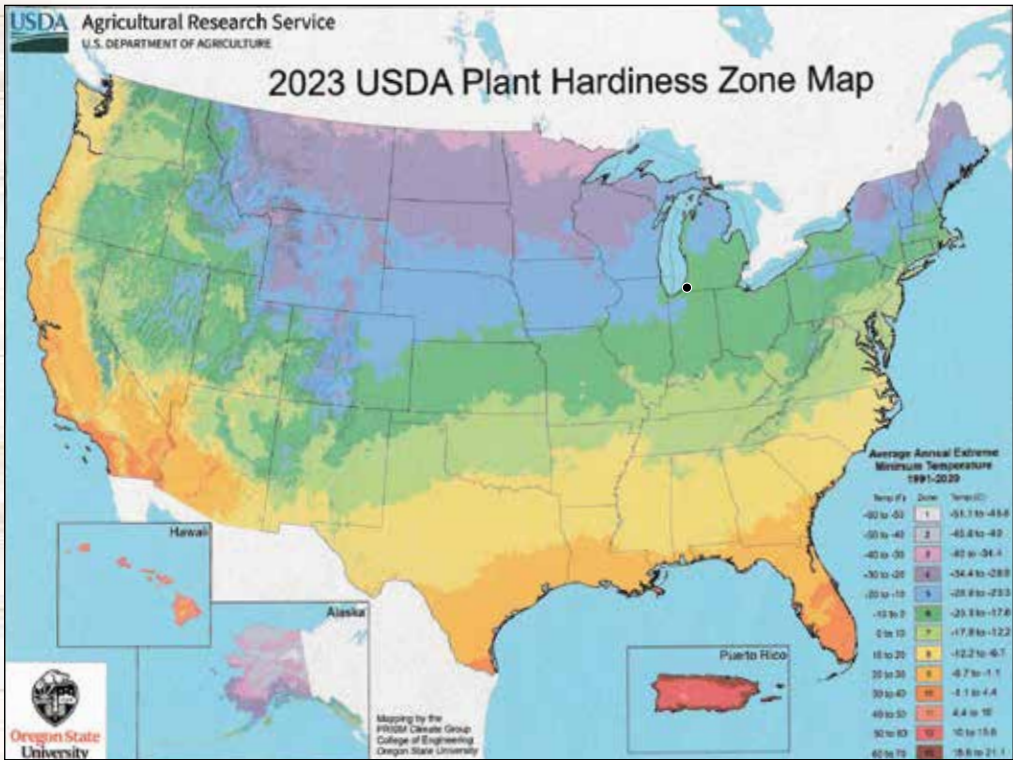
